Tracing the term from the end of the nineteenth century, when it was first popularized in the pages of the *Revue philosophique*, Peter Krapp examines the genealogy and history of the singular and unrepeatable experience of déjà vu. Peter Krapp, lecturer in the Department of Cultural Studies and Comparative Literature at the University of Minnesota, coedited "Medium Cool," a special issue of the *South Atlantic Quarterly* on contemporary media theory.
