polio vaccine vaccine derived poliovirus cdc May 24 2022 sep 20 2022 a vaccine derived poliovirus vdpv is a strain related to the weakened live poliovirus contained in oral polio vaccine opv if allowed to circulate in under or immunized populations for long enough or replicate in an immunodeficient individual the weakened virus can revert to a form that causes illness and paralysis
